School Vision

Every student shall be physically educated - that is, shall develop the knowledge and skills necessary to perform a variety of physical activities, maintain physical fitness, regularly participate in physical activity, understand the short and long-term benefits of physical activity, and value and enjoy physical activity as an ongoing part of a healthy lifestyle.

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

PE and School Sport Premium Funding Report

1. Following the success of the 2012 Olympic Games the Government have announced ring-fenced funding for the improvement of the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision within all primary schools. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding. The funding for William Hildyard is approximately £9,000.
2. At William Hildyard parents/carers will be aware of our tradition of providing excellent sporting experiences and opportunities for all our children and we believe that this funding will allow us to enhance our provision further.
3. This funding is being used in partnership with other Deeping Schools to employ a specialist PE teacher at a cost of approx. £1500. This is allowing us to raise the profile of PE - developing further the quality of teaching and learning within our broad, rich and engaging PE Curriculum. The PE specialist has worked with all teachers in a coaching role supporting the development of gymnastics and dance. Teachers have developed their skills and are even more confident planning, delivering and assessing PE.
4. At William Hildyard we will ensure that all pupils benefit regardless of sporting ability and that the most able pupils are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments at a cost of approx. £100 per tournament (see below for a list of the competitions and tournaments that we have been involved in). Links with the community clubs have formed and children have greater opportunities to compete.
5. Our extra-curricular programme offers a variety of opportunities in Physical Education. We see these additional experiences as extensions to all children's national curriculum programmes of study. The extra curriculum programme is open to all children of all abilities. The ethos is one of enjoyment with meaningful coaching and teaching so that children acquire skills, tactics and morals of fair play and respect. The teachers deliver this programme and we invite qualified coaches to support in the delivery of a wide range of activities provided.. Free non- traditional sports clubs are provided for all children at a cost of £240 per club. This allows 20 - 25 children to be involved in a sports club each term. Over 90% of our KS2 children have participated in at least one of our after school clubs.
6. New school PE equipment has been purchased to allow for high quality PE opportunities at a cost of approx. £200.
7. This year our school has become a member of Inspire Plus at an approx. cost of £1500. Inspire Plus is a sports charity that aims to provide support for governors and senior leaders to ensure that high quality PE is provided for all children. It also works with children to develop leadership skills and develop opportunities for all children to participate in sport and inspire them towards a lifetime of sport, culture and healthy living.
8. A new Programme of Study (REAL PE- programme is fully aligned to the new National Curriculum and Ofsted requirements and focuses on the development of agility, balance and coordination, healthy competition and cooperative learning) has been purchased and training has taken place including CPD for our sports coach. This will enable staff to provide a clear and structured programme of PE. This has been at a cost of £1000.

9. Our school teams have been very successful in local and district competitions, providing children with valuable experiences of competing at higher levels. Our football team has won this year's area tournament.
10. We will evaluate the impact of our funding use throughout the school year to monitor pupil progress and value for money.

Our PE curriculum is complemented by a range of inclusive sporting activities before and after school that captures the interest and enthusiasm of our children and nurtures a lifelong commitment to participation in sport and physical activity.
