



Spellings

All children receive a list of spellings on a Monday which they will practice daily in school. On Fridays, they will take a quiz to complete. One of the Y5 writing objectives is consistent and correct use of Y5/6 spelling words in their writing. There will be a test in school during the last week of term that tests a selection of words from across the term.

- Don't use social media in their bedrooms










Attendance is an important part of your Child's Education, they can not learn if they are not in school. Attendance = Attainment Every Day Counts

Persistent lateness can add up to too many days absent.

When a child arrives late at the start of the school day, it is very disruptive to their learning and the learning of their classmates.




We use a whole-class approach when teaching reading, using activities from Reading Explorers.

Children are explicitly taught reading skills including skimming, scanning, text retrieval, inferring, deducing, analysing and evaluating.

They are then encouraged to apply these skills when reading independently and reading across the curriculum.


We also enjoy a class text together.



Reading Every Day Goes a Very Long Way

Student A Reads

- 20 minutes per day
- 3,600 minutes per school year
- 1,800,000 words per year



Student B Reads

- 5 minutes per day
- 900 minutes per school year
- 282,000 words per year



Student C Reads

- 1 minute per day
- 180 minutes per school year
- 8,000 words per year

Family Learning What's it all about?

- A National Programme, where a variety of courses are offered to schools to support parents/carers gain confidence to support their child's learning in a fun and friendly way.
- The courses and workshops will give you tips and activity ideas in various subjects.
