



Maths

Place value to 10 million, followed by addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

We will be comparing, ordering and rounding numbers and investigating negative numbers. We will also recap prime, square and cube numbers, introduce long division and solve multistep problems with all four operations.



Art: Photography

The children will be creating photomontages, digital and abstract art using photography, and photorealistic self portraits.



History

We will be comparing the Ancient Maya and Anglo-Saxon civilisations, including their cities and homes, religions, the difficulties they faced and reasons for decline.



PE


Children will be participating in gymnastics and netball this term.

Science: Living Things and their Habitats

This unit looks at key characteristics of all living organisms and how animals, plants and microorganisms can be classified. We learn about classification keys and the scientist, Carl Linnaeus.



Computing Systems and Networks: Communication

Following a recap of online safety, we learn about internet addresses and how data is shared across the internet to allow people to work together.



RE: What does it mean if God is loving and holy?

Children will learn to make connections between biblical texts and what Christians believe about God, and weigh up how the idea of God as loving and holy might make a difference in the world today.



Spanish

The children will learn vocabulary based around classroom equipment and school uniform.



English

Along with each year group, we will begin the year with a module studying the Place Value (building blocks) of grammar and punctuation. We will then be writing a non-chronological report about famous outlaws, based on the book 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, which we will read as a class.

We will also continue studying short texts using the Reading Explorers programme.



PSHE: Being me in my world

We will be thinking about making others feel welcome, particularly how to respect everyone's right to learn.



Music

Using the theme of Fingal's Cave and the work of Mendelssohn, children will develop understanding of dynamics, pitch, tempo, improvisation and composition.
